Participants

Mentoring WEL is designed for emerging leaders already working within our businesses, agencies, and organizations. Participants will expand their professional connections, develop their personal skills, and gain a wider view and understanding of Wayne County. Each participant will be paired with a mentor who will serve as a one-on-one resource to further grow their knowledge of leadership.

Mentoring WEL was successfully piloted in 2021-22. Program evaluations included enthusiastic support for continuing and expanding the program in the future from both mentors and mentees.

The Participant/Mentee Experience

Following nomination and acceptance into the Mentoring WEL program, participants will take part in an orientation session and then meet for a series of monthly educational forums to learn about Wayne County. They will meet county leaders who are making a positive difference today.

Participants will be paired with a mentor to help them develop their skills and expand their knowledge from an experienced professional.

Participant Responsibilities

- Mentees should anticipate spending 8-12 hours per month on the program between September 2023 and June 2024.
- Mentees agree to make every effort to attend the orientation, educational sessions, regular one-on-one sessions with your mentor, and any other receptions/events that may be scheduled with the program
- Once nominated, prospective participants will complete a survey explaining their interest in and expectations for the program
- Upon accepted into the program, the participant's employer must sign the agreement, which sets out employee release time and other parameters of the program

Mentoring WEL Needs Mentors


